Dear Parents and Carers,

It's the time of year when we have to concentrate on completing the Health and Safety audit. This includes checking our fire procedures, swimming pool operating rules to safeguarding guidelines.

You will be glad to hear that everything is in place. However, a couple of e-safety issues have been raised in the process.

Firstly, some of our youngest children, Year 1 and 2, have told us in detail about the film 'IT' (which you will be aware is an 18), with some re-enacting scenes from the film. When we have spoken to them about it they have said that they have watched it through Youtube on their parents' phones and ipads. Please make sure that if your child is going to use your devices that they are supervised or the right parental settings are switched on.

It has also been brought to my attention that some of our Year 1 children have had Snapchat accounts opened in their name. This is a significant risk to your child. Snapchat's own guidelines state that account holders should be at least 13 years old. Snapchat is one of the apps most used by paedophiles to groom children.

Finally, I have included the term dates for 2018/2019. The INSET days will be 4th September 2018, 29th October 2018, 3rd and 4th January 2019 and 3rd June 2019.

REPORT FROM GOVERNORS

The Governing Board met on Monday for the first time this year. Following the recent appeal for parent governors we were delighted to hear that we have now filled both posts and look forward to meeting and welcoming our new governors shortly.

We then approved the inset days for the 2018/19 academic year. These were set as follows:

Thank you to everyone who completed the recent parent survey. Overall it was very positive. We considered the issues arising from the comments and whilst we cannot please everyone we have taken these on board. If you have any comments about how you feel the school can be improved we would welcome them.

The children in years 2 to 6 have also recently completed a survey. Again, we were pleased to hear that overall these were very positive. The surveys will be collated and the results shared with us in due course. The teachers and governors will be looking at the comments to see what we can do to address issues or develop their ideas. The children will have their feedback through the school council.

It was noted that the staff survey will take place this term.

Mr Raraty outlined what his tea parties involve and how the children are randomly selected to attend these. He explained that at the recent one the children were very aware of what is expected of them and their own learning levels.

Ordinarily we would have had an indication of our numbers for the Reception intake in September for this January meeting but these had not yet been received from ECC so any discussions surrounding this were postponed.

Mr Raraty updated us on the progress of the School Development Plan. A lot had been achieved last term and many points are ongoing. There are still a few outstanding items and these will be worked on over the coming months. Mr Crawley and Mr Wright have been developing a new assessment tracking system. Feedback has been good and teachers have reported that it's easy to use. They will be showcasing this to other schools in the near future. Preparation for the new mini reports to parents will start soon and work on the new learning hub has commenced. Behaviour was recently discussed at a staff meeting and a new policy is being developed.

We then heard about the new radio station. Mr Crawley told us about the team, their broadcasts and how music is now played in the playground. The children have given amazing feedback and are really enjoying listening to the broadcasts. Governors were encouraged to have a listen via the website. Whilst an article has been written for the Parish News, we offered other ideas for widening the publicity of this fantastic resource. Governors would like to extend their thanks to the Friends for the money given, in association with Tesco tokens, to allow our children to have this wonderful experience.

Governors have some training sessions coming up. Two are attending their induction course and others will be attending curriculum training in February.

Finally, we approved the Performance Management, Drugs Education and Exclusion policies.

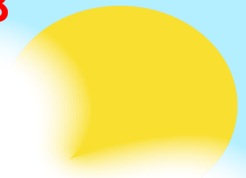

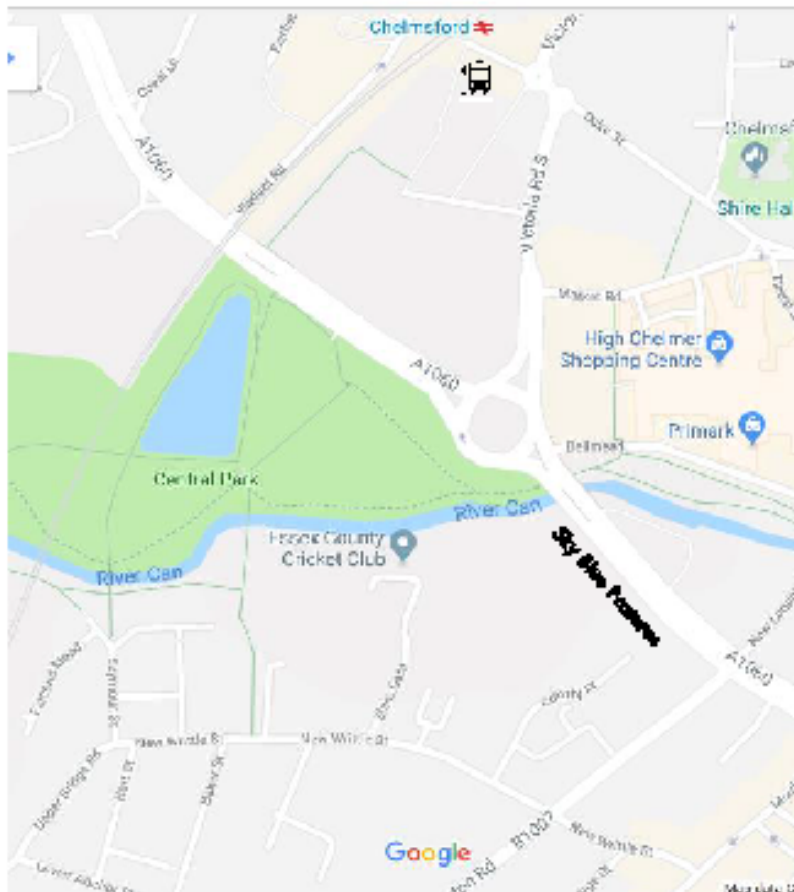

Disabled Access:

Via New Writtle Street. Accessible car park spaces are available.

By Train:

Chelmsford Railway Station is an approximate 10 minute walk from The Essex County Cricket Ground.

By Bus:

Chelmsford Bus Station is situated on Duke Street, next to Chelmsford Train Station, Bus numbers 42 and 100, stop on New London Road, which is approximately a two minute walk to the Ground, via New Writtle Street.

By Park & Ride:

Sandon CM2 7RZ – Located at Junction 18 on the A12.
Chelmer Valley CM3 3PR – Located on the A130 east of Essex Regiment Way.

On Foot:

The Main Entrance is on New Writtle Street, but the Ground can be entered via Sky Blue Pastures from the City Centre either via Parkway near High Chelmer car park and market, or from New London Road (by Marks & Spencer).

By Car (Pay & Display Car Park at Cricket Ground):
New Writtle Street, Chelmsford CM2 0PG.

From the North: Junction 19 on the A12 (Boreham). Take A138 to Town Centre, then A1060/Parkway to B1007 New London Road.

From the South: Junction 15 on the A12, take A414 exit to Harlow/Chelmsford. At the Wood Street roundabout take the first exit onto New London Road/B1007.

Parking Costs up to max. of £4.00 will be reimbursed
